Living in the Shadow of Sarah Winchester - Isabelle "Belle" Merriman

Isabelle Campbell "Belle" Pardee Merriman, was a younger sister to Sarah L. Winchester, bereaved wife of William Wirt Winchester, the only son of Oliver Winchester (Winchester Repeating Arms Company). Upon the death of William and Sarah's beloved daughter Baby Annie, Sarah moved to California with the vast wealth that she inherited from her husband's estate. Belle and her husband followed with their two children, Marion Isabel (Daisy) Merriman and William W. Merriman. Daisy was Sarah's favorite. After Isabelle's death in 1920 and Sarah's death in 1922, services were held in Palo Alto California and they lay at Alta Mesa Cemetery until the time Daisy traveled with their caskets by train to Evergreen Cemetery in New Haven. Members of the Sarah Winchester Mystery House in San Jose California will travel to Evergreen in May to tour and place a wreath on the grave of Isabelle, which is located in a different area of Evergreen than that of Sarah Winchester.



Dr. Allen Ross Diefendorf - 1871-1943 - Yale School of Medicine & State Hospital for the Insane



Allen Ross Diefendorf was born in Savannah, Wayne County, New York to Fletcher and Suzanne (Quackenbush) Diefendorf.

Fletcher, a manufacturer of staves and barrels and New York Assemblyman, accompanied Allen to Yale University in New Haven Connecticut and signed papers promising to pay for his son's education.

Allen graduated from Yale in 1894 with a BA and honors. He then entered the Yale School of Medicine in that same year and earned a medical degree in 1896.

He married Jeannette Cooper in 1895 and together they had four children.

Dr. Diefendorf taught at the Yale Medical School as a professor of mental and nervous diseases. At the same time, he was the Superintendent of the "State Hospital for the Insane" in Middletown Connecticut.

In 1907, he was one of a group of "alienists" (mental patients were considered "aliens to normal mental health") and those professionals who studied them were know as "alienists." Diefendorf was one of the professionals who testified regarding the insanity of Harry K. Thaw, who shot and killed Stanford White, architect of Madison Square Garden, at a performance in 1906.

Diefendorf served during WWI and treated many patients. He studied with Jung and Freud in Vienna in the summer of 1929 and became President of the Connecticut Society for Psychiatry in 1934. He was the first president of the Connecticut Psychiatric Society, and was considered "The Dean of Connecticut Psychiatry."

He was a founder of the Yale Skating Society and was recognized as an accomplished ice skater. He helped to bring world champion figure skater Sonja Henie to the United States in the 1930s.
